A draft City ordinance is slowly emerging that would nominate some blocks and neighborhoods for the National Registry of Historic Places. Advocates are trying appease property owners who fear "historic" status would interfere with development plans. Peter Ketter will be soliciting some help from interested persons.

5. PLANNING & ZONING (Kinney)

a. (Former) VALUE SKY PARK (used now by Brackenridge Hosp. for employee parking). CNA is negotiating with Seton on several issues. Seton has been responsive, and the process continues to inch forward.

b. CNA DEVELOPMENT GUIDELINES. There is need to revise and update Guidelines CNA fashioned in July 1999.
