

Cherrywood Neighborhood Association
General Meeting Notes
16 MAY 2012

1. Welcome; introductions

- SC present: Aaron Choate, Girard Kinney, Robin Peeples, Jeremy Mazur, Justin Irving, Rebecca Kohout, Jennifer Potter-Miller
- Total attendance: around 60 people, including guests and speakers

2. Steering Committee membership updates

- Chris Wilson and Robin Peeples are stepping down. There are now 4 open positions.
- Lia Davis has applied to join the SC. The CNA membership approved unanimously.

3. Urban Patchworks update (Terry Dyke)

- Produce from the current locations are available at Ingredients.

4. Historical preservation presentation (Rebecca Kohout & UT School of Architecture representatives)

- Neighbors can contribute history, photos and other information about their homes and neighborhood to a wiki run by the architecture school.
- Their purpose is to have a complete and singular reference for historical sites in Austin.

- David Boston has suggested that one additional use of the survey could be to record the locations of large trees.

5. Hancock golf course (Emily Schwartz [neighbor] and Kevin Gomillion [COA])

- Emily explained her proposal for exploring future uses of the golf course, should efforts to revitalize it for golfers not prove successful.
- Kevin explained the process of planning for Hancock and gathering community feedback thus far.
- Kevin relayed that the city's plan is fairly set to give the golf course 2 years to become more successful and valuable, and reevaluate if it hasn't.
- The neighborhood agreed to keep monitoring and evaluating the issue with plans to formalize a proposal to the city eventually.

6. 4020 Airport property zoning

- Aaron gave a history of the neighborhood's zoning work and deliberations thus far.
- After much discussion, a neighbor moved to approve the proposal created by the task force for the neighborhood.
- After further discussion, a vote was called at 8:12pm. 16 in favor, 40 opposed.

The motion was not passed. The neighborhood will not present an official endorsement for the plan (or for any other at this juncture) to city council.

—It is clear that a large number of neighbors with varying views on the issue will bring proposals to the city on their own.

7. There will be a meeting on May 24 at 6:30pm at Genesis Presbyterian Church to discuss the future neighborhood alignment of Cherrywood residents north of 38th 1/2.
